ABOUT THIS INTERNSHIP

The Religious Studies Center—the publications arm of Religious Education at BYU—is now looking for a student editing intern to assist with proofreading and editing during winter semester and beyond.

This paid internship is a great opportunity for students seeking stimulating part-time work (15–20 hours a week, up to 30 for spring and summer terms) suited to career interests in editing or publishing.

Interns earn a graduated wage and optional university credit. Bonuses include work on projects supportive of Latter-day Saint beliefs, flexible hours, mentoring, and a campus work site.

WHAT WE ARE LOOKING FOR

Preferred applicants have high grades in editing classes and experience working on campus publications. They also do well on an RSC editing test and in an interview.

HOW TO APPLY

- Include in your résumé your overall GPA, your grades in any editing classes, and your expected graduation date.
- List any editing-related classes in which you are currently enrolled.
